- In treatment for PTSD and/or TBI a minimum of 8 consecutive months and can provide a referral from a licensed practitioner.
- Support system in place (friends and/or family)
- Financially and physically able to care for the needs of a Service Dog in a loving and safe environment (home)
- Can maintain a regular schedule that includes outings to places such as work, school, or shopping and restaurants with a Service Dog.
